Resurvey on Buck Forest

Buck Forest (PG Co. #415) has its beginnings in 1747 when 1680 acres was surveyed for Daniel Dulany (Esquire) and in 1752 the land was patented to Daniel Dulany Jr. The Resurvey on Buck Forest 3000 acres was patented to Daniel Dulany in 1753 (Fr. Co. #3337) and is located 3 miles south of Emmitsburg along Motters Station Road. This tract became one of several Daniel Dulany leased lots from across Frederick County. When the first tenants arrived or who they were is unknown.


The land was inherited by Benjamin Tasker Dulany upon the death of Daniel Dulany in 1797. In 1811 Benjamin T. & Elizabeth Dulany (Alexandria, District of Columbia) executed a "Deed of Trust" (Fr Co. Deed WR 42-114) with their son Daniel French Dulany (Fairfax Co. VA.). The deed states "The land is to be sold to benefit Elizabeth Dulany and their unmarried children". The tenant lots of various acreage were sold from 1812-1817.

As the fate of Dulany's other leased tracts the tenants lost any claim to improvements made to the property. Only recourse was to buy the lots back when sold which few ever did.

Plat of Resurvey on Buck Forest showing the 17 tenant lots was made in 1798 by Lawrence Brengle (Fr Co. Deed WR 46-317).


