Merry Land Tract (Frederick County)

Located in southwestern Frederick County and surrounds the town of Petersville then extends to the Potomac River. Merry Land (PG Co. Patent# 1446 & 1447) containing 6300 Acres sometimes called Maryland was first surveyed in 1732 for Captain John Covill. John Covill died in 1756 and his brother Thomas Covill inherited the land. Thomas Covill died in 1766 in Virginia with George Washington serving as one of the executors.

In 1762 Charles Beatty surveyed the tract showing a subdivision of 22 lots. The tract was sold in 1772 to Adam West, Cumberland Wilson and Thomas Montgomery (Fr Co. Deed N-657). Shortly after 1772 sale the lots commenced


