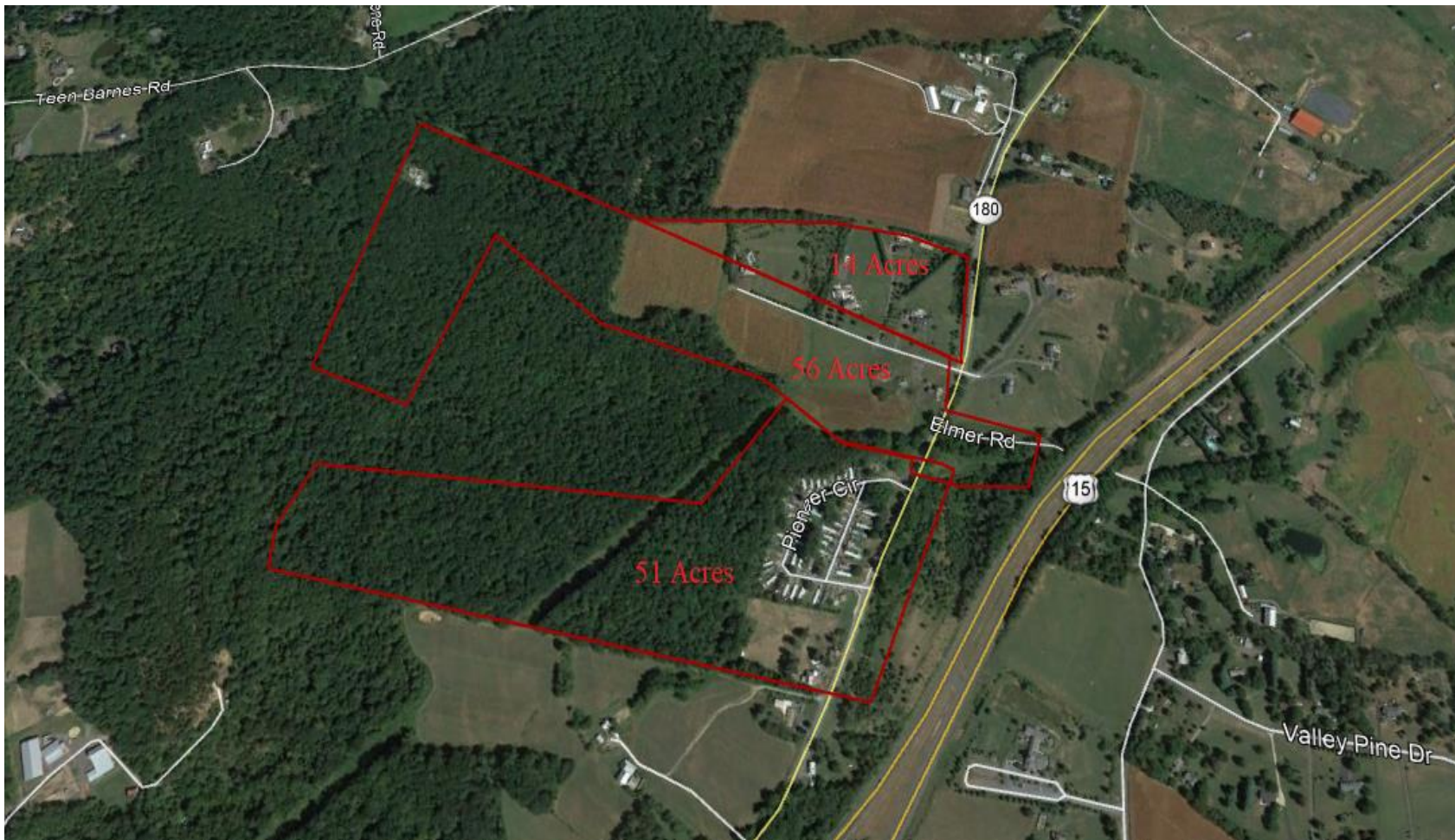
Jacob Honaker Farm has its origins in the tracts Mount Pleasant and Resurvey on Part of Hazel Thickett. The parcels that make up the Honaker property were first surveyed for Jacob Honaker in 1758 and 1761. Jacob Honaker sold the land (121 acres) in 1765 to Frederick Eyson and moved to Virginia.

The land went thru Frederick Eyson, John Wilson, Thomas Taylor and Thomas Stevenson. In 1779 the land was deeded to Andrew Heim. In 1814 Andrew Heim sold the land to his son David Heim.

The David Heim House (Two story stone) was built in 1815. The house still stands and is in excellent condition. The 1825 Frederick County Tax shows David Heim (District 2) 150 acres of land (Mount Pleasant) with stone house tavern. Apparently the house doubled as a tavern.

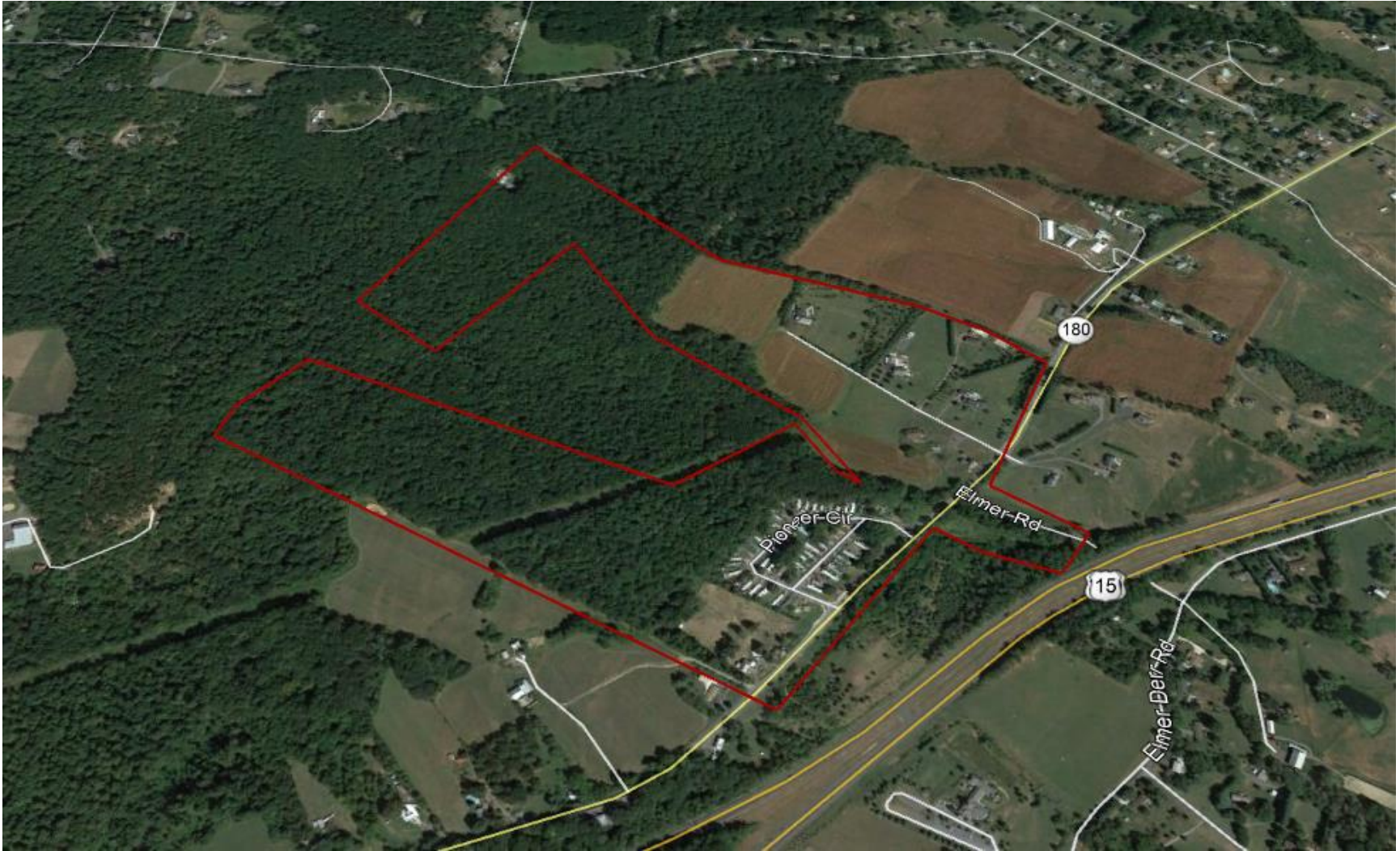
The land remained in the Heim Family until 1842 when 93.25 acres was sold to Henry Culler and the remaining land sold to Henry Culler in 1845.
