Shew/Shuey (Wife of Henry Shew/Shuey) 1824-1863</p>	<p>Ca Co.</p>	<p>Samuel Carr (1794-1864) obtained the farm known as the Dorsey Farm from Archibald Dorsey in 1841 (Ca. Co. Deed WW 6-263 157 Acres). Samuel Carr 1794-1864 willed the farm (Ca. Co. Will JMP 3-267 1864) to his grandson Samuel Carr (Son of James W. Carr). Carroll Co. Cemeteries (Carr Family5-43). The Carr Family Cemetery is mentioned in Howard and Ruth Carr's <i>Family History of Samuel and Sidney Carr and Their Descendants</i>. (Maryland Jesse P. Carr (1874-1943) said there was a stone house standing about 500 feet in front of the barn. About the same distance in front of the house was the cemetery. There was also a slave cemetery located south of the house on a knoll. This property was known as the Dorsey Farm because Samuel Carr, a native of Ireland, bought it from Archibald Dorsey in 1841. Samuel married Sidney Ann Randall in 1820 and they are buried side by side. The Carr family owned this land for 112 years. Information not found on Find A Grave. Administration Account JMP 5-418 1858 list payment for a tombstone. Unknown if anyone is buried on the farm. No information found on Find A Grave or Carroll County Cemetery List Farm was located between Bloom Road & Mueller Road Westminster MD.39.481018° -77.038036°</p>

Co.</p>	<p>The land where the graveyard was located was obtained in 1752 by Samuel Durbin 1698-1752 (Ba. Co. Deed TR D-361 150 Acres Tract-Cobbs Choice). Samuel Durbin (1698-1752) willed (Fr. Co. Will Book A-78 1752) to his son William Durbin (1726-1773) 100 acres and his son Samuel Durbin (1727-1808) 50 acres part of Cobbs Choice. William Durbin (1726-1773) obtained the land where the graveyard is located and confirmed by Fr. Co. Deed M-433 1769 100 Acres. William Durbin (1726-1773) left no will. Only probate record found is his inventory (Fr. Co. Inventory Book C-145 1773). Land then went to his son William Durbin (1749-1820) who willed the land to his son Nicholas Durbin (Fr. Co. Will HS 3-393 1820).</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Were the early Durbin Family members listed owning the land buried there?</p> <p>Carroll County Cemetery List (Durbin Family 5-53) Paul Beard supplied the Carroll County Genealogical Society with information about the disappearance of this cemetery. The tombstones were removed and given to either the Westminster United Methodist Church or to Western Maryland College, but the bodies were not disinterred. The removal took place before Paul Beard's father sold his property to Earl Griswold perhaps sometime in the 1960s or 1970s. Mr. Beard was a farmer and was tired of plowing around the small cemetery. No identified burials. The 1767 Durbin House still stands. <p>John Hamblton D. 1832 Margaret Bond Hamblton D. <1832</p>	<p>Ca. Co.</p>	<p>Frederick Co. 1815 Property Tax is the first appearance of John Hamblton in the area. No deed has been found when he first obtained property. Thomas Hamblton (Son and executor of John Hamblton) sells the farm in 1840 to Abraham Baile (Ca. Co. Deed JS 9-450 107 Acres). The 1832 will of John Hamblton (Fr. Co. Will GME 1-420) makes no mention of his wife and only list his children and also no directions on his land.</p>

		<p>Carroll County Cemeteries List (Hambelton Family 5-44) states 2 headstones were found in a cow pasture on the north side of Chapel Road at Kate Wagner Road. This is not the location of the John Hambelton Farm sold by his son in 1840. A deed search was made and the location of the Hambelton Farm was at Woodland Circle and Stone Chapel Road. In the 1877 Carroll County Atlas Westminster District 7 the farm owner was Levi Manahan. Farm Location- 39.532472° -77.037584° Headstone Location- 39.542821° -77.020742°. Ephraim Lindsay 1810-1891 in 1880 sells 176 acres to his son Joseph Lindsay (Ca. Co. Deed FTS 54-75). In the will of Ephraim Lindsay (Ca. Co. Will GMP 6-495 1891) he leaves his lot and house in Westminster to his 3rd wife Laura V. Barnes Lindsay (1848-1928). Will also states “Desire that his son Joseph Lindsay keep the family burial ground on his farm in good condition” Current condition of the headstones is unknown. Information not found on Find A Grave. Carroll County Cemetery List (Lindsay Family 5-34) States graveyard was found in 1982 with 9 headstones located. Carroll County Cemetery List (Porter Family 5-50) States 2 stones found for 1 st wife Nancy Porter and daughter Barbary Porter. Current location of the headstones is unknown. William Yohn 1800-1871 Mary Wampler Yohn (Relict of John Yohn) 1779-1847 Daughters of Mary Yohn 1779-1847	Ca. Co.	Ludwick Wampler 1752-1826 (Father of Mary Wampler Yohn) obtained the land where the Yohn Cemetery is located in 1813 from Joshua Porter (Ba. Co. Deed WG 126-140). In the 1826 will of Ludwick Wampler (Fr. Co. Will HS 3-483) I leave to my daughter Mary Yohn my farm in Baltimore County. After the death of Mary Yohn I bequeath the farm to her three children William Yohn, Elizabeth Powder and Mary Yohn. A dispute over the land led to Chancery Court and the land went to William Yohn, Elizabeth Powder and Mary Yohn (Ba. Co. Deed TK 234-282 1833) The sisters of William Yohn sell their right to the land to William Yohn in 1849 (Ca. Co. Deed JBB 13-287). The land then went to

Deed 170-583) "Except the family burial ground". In 1973 the property made went to Edward W. Titus (Ca. Co. Deed 551-545). Carroll County Cemetery List (Yohn Family 5-41) States Edward W. Titus owned the property in 1991 when the graveyard was discovered. The cemetery now amounts to nothing but an overgrown area approximately 60 x 30 feet with depressions, mounds, small trees, groundhog holes, and the two stones listed. Deed JBB 18-233 150 Acres 1853 (2 burial grounds not listed).</p> <p>The reason for 2 burial grounds is unknown. It is believed Benjamin Young (1757-1828) along with his wife and children except Manoah Young (1800-1888) and Micajah Young (1804-1858) are buried here. They are not listed on Find A Grave or Carroll County MD. Burial Records.</p> <p>Land is located on the north side of Rt. 26 and now occupied by Century High School and Linton Springs Elementary Eldersburg MD. <p>Walter Funderburg Sr. 1715-1778 Catherine Stoll Funderburg 1725-1794</p>	<p>Fr. Co.</p>	<p>Walter Funderburg will executed May 29, 1778 naming therein his wife, Catherine, and his ten children. The will was probated Oct. 16, 1778 (Frederick Court House, G.M. No. 1, Folio 90). He therefore died during this interum at the approximate age of 63 (if not a few years older). He was buried on a hilltop on his own farm. Catherine, b. Dec. 4, 1725, is listed in the First U. S. Census 1790, Frederick County, Maryland and is the last extant record of her. Thus she survived her husband by at 12</p>

years. She lived to the age of 65 or more, and was buried beside Walter in the family cemetery on the hilltop on their own farm.

Third son of Immigrant Ancestor, Walther von der ,Burg.Walter Vonderburg-that appears to be his preferred way of spelling the name; and writing it, "in beautiful German script"-(also Funderburg) had reached, perhaps, his 19th birthday when his father died, in 1778, leaving him "head of household," with his mother and the four younger siblings; David, Noah, Rachel, Esther. This arrangement lasted for some five years. In the meantime, Walter, having attained his majority, became rightful owner of the homeplace; but the mother, as provided in the father's will, was to continue possession of "my Dwelling house," it said, "while She remains my Widow." Having gone to Lancaster, Pennsylvania, seeking a bride, "Walter brought his wife home to the Father's house." Shortly afterwards, he sold or traded his interest in the Plantation to elder brother Daniel and then acquired the "Prospect 1776" estate (c. 1786) where he lived generously until his death; buried there in the family plot. By winding undulating road1 Prospect was about 12 or 15 miles west of the Plantation on the drafts of Israel Creek. While he was a small child, his parents moved (1760-62) from west of Catoctin Mountain, to the lands near Johnsville. His place of birth other than Frederick County, is not determined. Co.	<p>Casper Smith first came to the area in 1753 and started buying up land to make his tract Resurvey on Mt. Olivet, Tied Dog & Sweedland 28 Oct 1765 (Fr Co. Patent # 3662/1174 Acres). Portions were sold before Casper Smith died in 1780 (Fr. Co. Will Book 1777-1784 Vol. 1 page 187) and then left the remainder to his wife Christina 595 acres. Christina Smith had a new survey made in 1792 with the tract named Timber Plenty (Fr. Co. Patent #4807 493.5 Acres) She died in 1799 and left the land to son Daniel Smith. He had a new survey made in 1813 with the tract named Mount Parnassus Fr. Co. Patent# 2713/544 Acres. Daniel Smith died in 1839 (Fr. Co. Will GME 2-363). Information on Woolf Family burials is listed. The book eludes to the fact that John Woolf was buried on the Resurvey on Israels Lot where he made his home. The will of John Woolf states his home place was on tract Resurvey on Mt. Olivet Tied Dog & Sweedland. The statement he was buried on Resurvey on Israels Lot could be true as this was part his original land holdings. The distance between his home place and Resurvey on Israels Lot is about 1.5 miles.</p> <p>1926 Letter: Grover A. Wolf (of Sabillasville MD.) “I can show you where Garrett Wolf lived when he died and where he was buried. I can show you near about the spot he was buried about 5 miles southeast of Sabillasville in a field which was a garden. There are no marks or stones to mark the grave”. The information listed is suspect.</p> <p>Garrett Woolf (1767-1859) sold his fathers home place in 1838. Fr. Co. Equity Case JWLC-2, 511-521 1861 shows he was living on Harbaughs Chance when he died. The statement the spot was 5 miles southeast of Sabillasville is an error. This would place it on the edge of Thurmont MD.</p> <p>The burial location for John Woolf with his wife and children except Amelia Woolf Flautt (1776-1818) is unknown. No information was found in Find A Grave or Names In Stone.
