No headstones located</p> <p>Francis Davis obtained the land in 1763 (Provincial Court Deed DD 3-170 700 Acres) Tract names- Valley of Strife and Buck Bottom. Francis Davis D. 1778 (Ba. Co. Will Vol. 3-370 1778) States "Wife Katherine Davis to live in my dwelling house until my youngest son comes of age 21 then the land be divided between my sons Rezin, Mathias, Samuel, Zachariah and Thomas Davis and daughters Lucy & Nancy Davis".</p> <p>Zachariah Davis obtained the land where the graveyard is located. Zachariah Davis D. 1829 wills (Ba. Co. Will Vol. 13-191 1829) to his wife Elizabeth Davis the estate until her death. Then upon her death to their children Cordelia, Amos, Ezra, Thomas, Susan, William, Zachariah, Amelia and Elizabeth. In 1845 Cordelia & Amelia Davis obtained the land from the heirs (Ca. Co. Deed JS 6-136 166 Acres).</p> <p>Cordelia Davis the sold the land to her brother in law Samuel England in 1856 (Ca. Co. Deed JBB 19-334). Samuel England sold the land to Leonard C. Frost in 1858 (Ca. Co. Deed GEW 24-113) with graveyard. Leonard C. Frost sells back to Samuel England 40 acres in 1858 which includes the graveyard (Ca. Co. Deed GEW 24-393). Samuel England sells the land after the deaths of Cordelia & Amelia Davis with burial ground in 1863 to Elizabeth Jewett (Ca. Co. Deed GEW 29-358). Cordelia age 53 & Amelia Davis age 43 appear in the 1850 Ca. Co. Census living with Samuel England. Amelia Davis last appears in the 1860 Ca. Co. Census living with Samuel England. Only farm buildings left is the barn.</p> <p>Davis Streaker in 1971 was unable to locate the burial ground.</p> <p>Boteler Road Mt. Airy MD. Co.</p>	<p>Carroll County Cemeteries (Garrettson family 4-33) Aquila Garrettson D. 1837 (Ca. Co. Will JB 1-25 1837) states “Reserve a piece of ground sufficient for 6 graves between the chestnut tree and the barn where I desire to be buried. 1837 Carroll County MD. Tax list Aquilia Garrettson with 18 acres of the Tract-Flagg Meadow. This matches the area indicated where the headstone was located. Mary Hall obtained her portion from the heirs in 1816 (Fr. Deed JS 2-416 68 Acres) and sold her portion which included the location of the house and graveyard to Peregrine Harp in 1829 (Fr. Co. Deed JS 31-52) with no graveyard mentioned. 4 headstones located current condition unknown. Mary Hall 1834 Will (Fr. Co. GME 2-13). Co.</p>	<p>Carroll County Cemeteries List 7-35 (Gillis/Jenkins Family) was located on the tract Eppington Forest. The first mention of a graveyard is in Ca. Deed JBB 39-131 60 Acres 1867 Rezin T. Jenkins to George W. Dobbs. Subsequent deeds 45-260 1875/118-284 1911/138-264 1921 also mention the graveyard. Names mentioned prior to the 1867 deed going back to 1803 are Julia Morton, Leonard Jarvis, Henry Payson and William Winchester. The last information found on Rezin T. Jenkins is him selling land in 1885 along with his wife Cecilia Jenkins. No probate or burial information has been located. Area is now fenced in with only scattered unmarked stones located. Robert Shipley dies in 1832 (Ba. Co. Will 14-124 1832) and directs Dorseys Neglect be sold. Lewis Shipley (son of Robert Shipley D. 1832) obtains 100 acres (1837 Carroll Co. Tax). Lewis Shipley appears on 1850 ca. Co. Census with wife Elizabeth and children, John H., Henry, Margaret & Emily. In the Ca. Co. MD. 1860 Census Elizabeth Shipley appears for the last time with 3 of her children. Henry B. Shipley (etal.) in 1865 sells the 100 acres (Ca. Co. Deed WAMCK 32-106 1832) called Turkey Thickett to William P. Gorsuch except 1/8 acre for family burial ground. Unknown if any headstones exist. Gorsuch Switch Road Eldersburg MD. Co.</p>	<p>Carroll County Cemeteries (Spurrier Family 7-24) The Democratic Advocate of December 29, 1866 recorded the death of Greenbury Spurrier, “one of the defenders of Baltimore,” who died in the “83rd year of age.” Davis Streaker brought this cemetery to the attention of the Carroll County Genealogical Society. Green Spurrier 1737-1787 obtained the land in 1773 (Provincial Court Deed DD 5-579 112 Acres) Tract-Valley of Strife. Green Spurrier willed (Ba. Co. Will 1774-1791 Vo. 4-205 1787) the land to his pregnant wife Avis Spurrier. If Avis Spurrier is to remarry or die the land is to be sold and proceeds divided up between the children. Note: Greenbury Spurrier D. 1866 is a nephew of Alpheus Spurrier Alpheus Spurrier D. 1850 (Ca. Co. Admin. Bond 1837-1853 page 607). With the following children listed (Ca. Co. Admin. <p>(Burial location unknown) Eliza Ward Stocksdale 1806-1895 Parents Edward Stocksdale D. 1842 Married Helen Stocksdale 1777-1840</p>		<p>Eliza Ward Stocksdale 1806-1895 (wife of Solomon Stocksdale) is buried at Providence Cemetery Gamber MD. Solomon Stocksdale 1804-1856 is not listed there. Edward Stockdale D. 1841 Carroll County 1837 Tax list Tracts-Hookers Meadow, Cold Saturday & Point Intelligence with brickhouse, stone barn & grist mill (Stocksdales Mill). Current property tax record shows brick house with 1818 build date. Edward Stockdale D. 1842 (Ca. Co. Will JB 1-20 1842) divided his 309 acres of land between sons Solomon Stockdale & Noah Stockdale. The land ran from Route 140 southwest back through Old Kays Mill Road. Soloman Stocksdales' portion 196 acres which included the mill covered Old Kays Mill Road.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Note</p> <p>Solomon Stocksdale (1804-1856) and his parents are probably buried here. Unknown if it has any connection to the burial ground listed for Carroll County Cemeteries (Stocksdale Family 4-32) Elizabeth Williams Stocksdale (1829-1854) buried here was the wife of Noah Stockdale brother of Solomon Stocksdale whose land connected.</p> <p>Old Kays Mill Rd. & Hughes Road Finksburg MD.
