Co.</p>	<p>Obituary states “Mary Elizabeth Myers (Colored) of Carroll Co. who was a slave for the Gaither Family in Frederick County dies at 108 at the home of her son Elmer Myers in Westminster”. Death certificate shows her husband as Dennis Myers with fathers name unknown and mothers name as Leathy Byers? 1880 Frederick Co. Census (Liberty District) list Dennis Myers age 36 & Mary Myers age 42. Obituary & death certificate state burial was made at Mt. Olive Cemetery. The death certificate for Dennis Edward Myers list father as John Myers with no mothers name listed and list wife as Mary E. Myers. Death certificate shows place of death as Mt. Olive. Co.</p>	<p>Philip Angleberry Sr. is involved with two tracts Wimfinintal north of Lewistown & Wimpinnytal Walter Martz Road Frederick.</p> <p>Philip Angelberger obtains the tract Wimfinintal (Fr. Co. Patent #5203 100 Ac.) in 1755 which was north of Lewistown. In 1755 Philip Angleberry Sr. has the tract Low Water surveyed (Fr. Co. Patent# 2560 6 Ac.). Survey states “80 perches from Philip Angleberrys house”. This land is next to the tract Wimpinnytal (PG. Co. Patent# 2369 100 Ac.) surveyed for Daniel Dulany in 1744. In the survey it states “Daniel Dulany transfers his rights to the tract to Philip Angleberry son of Philip Angleberry in 1761”.</p> <p>Philip Angleberry Jr. obtains the patent to Wimpinnytal in 1761. With the information on Low Water</p>

Co. Deed F-895 100 Ac.) to George Tenor in 1759.</p> <p>Philip Angelberger Sr. dies in 1761 (Fr. Co. Will A 1-155). Philip Angelberger Jr. dies in 1787 (Fr. Co. Inventory GM 2-36) with wife Susannah Angleberger (Executrix). The land goes to Jacob Angleberger (Fr. Co. Tax 1798/1825/1835) who dies in 1854 (Fr. Co. Will TS 1-307). In 1855 Philip & Mary Angleberger (Clark Co. Ohio) son on Philip & Susanna Angleberger sells the land of Jacob Angelberger (Fr. Co. Deed ES 5-676 87 Ac.) to William M. Feaga. In 1856 David S. Angleberger & Elias Grove obtain 6 square perches of land from William M. Feaga for the family burial ground already established (Fr. Co. Deed ES 8-243) on the tract Wimpinnytell.</p> <p>Holdcraft located 3 headstones in 1960 Susanna Angleberger 1748-1840/ Margaret Angleberger Heffner 1777-1847/ Dennis Angleberger 1834-1836. Likely more burials were made.</p> <p>Walter Martz Road Frederick MD. 39.4668-77.44215</p> <p>Note</p> <p>In the 1854 will of Jacob Angleberger he leaves his personal property to his nephews David S. Angleberger & George W. Angleberger who are sons of Philip & Mary Angleberger</p> <p>Questions</p> <p>Curious that Philip Angelberger Sr. & Philip Angelberger Jr. tract names are similar but in different locations miles apart. Is Philip Angelberger Sr. & wife Catherine Angelberger buried here also? Is Susanna Anglebergers husband Philip Angelberger Jr. buried here? Is their son Jacob Angleberger D. 1854 buried here? Is Jacob Heffner the husband of Margret Angleberger Heffner buried here? Is George Angleberger D. 1867 buried here with his wife. None of the family members show up in Names in Stone or Find a Grave outside of the three people found by Holdcraft.</p>

Alexander Brandenburg 1720-1793 obtains the land where the graveyard is located in 1779 (Fr. Co. Deed WR 2-101 123 Ac.) tract of land called Chance. In 1793 Alexander Brandenburg dies (Fr. Co. Will GME 2-479) and leaves the farm to his son Jacob Brandenburg. Prior to the death of Alexander Brandenburg he had purchased additional land and had started the process to obtain a new patent called Resurvey on Chance surveyed in 1794 and patented to Jacob Brandenburg in 1818 (Fr. Co. Patent# 3351 153.5 Ac.). Anna Brandenburg dies in 1809 (Fr. Co. Will RB1-3). In 1838 Jacob Brandenburg dies (Fr. Co. Will GME 2-296) and leaves the farm to his wife Elizabeth Brandenburg. In 1854 the farm was sold to Thomas Baker by the Executors of Jacob Brandenburgs last will and testament. (Fr. Co. Deed ES 4-419 153.5 Ac.-1/2 acre reserved for family burial ground. The graveyard is still mentioned in deeds up to 1917 (Fr. Co. Deed 322-31). In the Alexander Brandenburg family history it states “One of the early Brandenburg descendants who

Co. Deed JS 40-39 34 Ac.) & in 1853 (Fr. Co. Deed ES 4-100 148 Ac.). Both Osborn & Rachel Brashear along with some of their children show up on the 1870 Fr. Co. Census. Osborn Brashear dies in 1877 (Fr. Co. Will JRR 1-122) which lists his wife and children. The farm ends up with his daughter Mary Jane Brashear who dies in 1909 (Fr. Co. Will WBC 2-122) which shows money left to maintain the family graveyard. In 1910 the farm is sold (Fr. Co. Deed 290-281 1910) with family graveyard reserved. Last mention of graveyard is in 1925 (Fr. Co. Deed 354-123). Unknown to as to how many family members are buried here. Current location of the graveyard is unknown. Old Bohn Rd. Mt Airy MD. The information showing Anna 1832-1900 as his wife is wrong this is his sister.</p> <p>Mary Dorsey Age 79 wife of Levin Dorsey is the mother of Rachel Dorsey Brashear. Mary Crockley Dorsey was living with her son Owen Dorsey (1850 Montgomery Co. MD. In 1823 West Burgess deeds to his children (Fr. Co. Deed JS 18-661 160 Ac.). West Burgess dies in 1825 (Fr. Co. Will HS 3-415) and leaves all property to his children. Rachel Burgess is shown in the 1850 Fr. Co. Census living with her children and dies later that year. From information on the 1850-1880 Fr. Co. Census the majority of the children remained single and lived together on the farm. One stone found with names B.W.W. Joshua Cain dies in 1851 (Fr. Co. Admin Bonds TS 1-331). The farm went to his wife Ann D. Cain who died in 1860 (Fr. Co. Admin Bonds APK 1-249). The farm eventually ended up with their daughter Ann D. Cain Brashear. In 1894 upon the death of Ann D. Cain Brashear the farm was sold (Fr. Deed JJJ 7-299 102 Ac. with graveyard reserved). Will GME 1-573) with no wife listed and leaves the remaining part of his land to his son Jacob Engel. In 1870 Jacob & Mary Engle execute a 99 year lease (Fr. Co. Deed CM 5-671) with Jesse Simmons to provide care for the remainder of their lives. Holdcraft list 6 headstones with Finding Names in Stone (Bryan Main 2022) showing only 2 headstones-Susannah Simmons D. 1856 Age 72 & fragmented stone showing In her 69th year. In 1839 Christian Hauver (son of Peter Hauver) obtains the land (Fr. Co. Deed HS 9-280 400 Ac.). The graveyard lot is reserved today showing on Fr. Co. Plat 0052/0109. Deed Index it shows George Oats deeding land to Peter Oats. When you view the deed (Fr. Co. Deed WR 26-140 1804) it shows Peter & George Hauver. Co.</p>	<p>Names in Stone lists the Thurmont Hoover Family Cemetery with about 10 graves and 1 named stone. The land where the cemetery is located was obtained by Joseph & Christian Hoover in 1764 (Fr. Co. Deed J-887 195.5 Ac.). The tract was known as Two Brothers being part of a tract called Arnolds Delight. In 1787 Christian Hoover (1750-1809) obtained his brother Joseph Hoovers right to the land (Fr. Co. Deed WR 8-390 195.5 Ac.). Christian Hoover dies in 1809 (Fr. Co. Inventory RB 2-280) and his wife Magdalena Hoover dies in 1821 (Fr. Co. Admin. Bond HS 3-480) with her son Daniel Hoover listed as Administrator. Daniel Hoover (1790-1863) sold the land to his brother Peter Hoover (Fr. Co. Deed JS 22-435 184.5 Ac.). In 1826 Peter Hoover sold the land back to his brother Daniel Hoover (1790-1863) Fr. Co. Deed JS 27-67 184.5 Ac.). Along Owens Creek Apples Church Road Thurmont MD. Co.</p>	<p>Richard Johnson first started obtaining land where the house and graveyard are located in 1810 (Fr. Co. Deed WR 39-133 74 Ac.) part of the tracts Resurvey on Plummers Delight and What You Will. In 1835 the land was sold to Benjamin Dudderar (Fr. Co. Deed JS 49-26 361.25 Ac.). Richard Johnson dies in 1839 with no probate records located. Information found on their son shows Richard D. Johnson went to Cumberland from Frederick and in 1839 and opened a drug store. Evidently his mother Julianna Johnson went with him. Both are buried at Rose Hill Cemetery Cumberland MD. Maryland Historical Trust File F-7-16 Richard Johnson House states “A grave stone was salvaged from a family graveyard near the house which was located near a fence behind the house. It is inscribed Laura Johnson daughter of Richard and Julianna Johnson. The Johnsons had three children who survived to adulthood. Other gravestones were removed from the property in the mid-20th century”. The headstone of Laura Johnson is still at the Johnson House which is still standing. It is assumed that Richard Johnson was buried here also. Location of other headstones is unknown. It is probable that Richard Johnson (1755-1841) his wife and Ephraim Johnson (1788->1860) and his wife Margaret Mobberly Johnson (1800->1860) are buried on the farm with location unknown. Richard Johnson and his son Ephraim Johnson along with his wife Margaret Johnson are not found on Find a Grave. James T. Johnson and his wife Mary E. Williams Johnson are buried at Clarksburg United Methodist Church Cemetery Clarksburg MD.

Richard Johnson 1755-1841 (Revolutionary War Soldier)

United States Pensions 1834-1916: Declaration of Ephraim Johnson in order to obtain the benefit of an act of Congress passed 7th June 1832 granting pensions in certain cases in the County of Montgomery State of Maryland. On this ninth day of November 1847 Ephraim Johnson a resident of the County and State aforesaid aged about fifty six years provided that he is the son and only surviving child and heir of Richard Johnson who was a Soldier in the War of the Revolution late of said County. Stated that he frequently heard his father say that when he arrived at the age of 21 years he enlisted in the Army of the Revolution as a Private. He also deposes and says that his said father died on the 26th day of March 1841 at the age of 86 years 6 months and 10 days having survived his wife that he is his only heir.

Wife of Richard Johnson (1755-1841)

During research a clue has surfaced as to the identity of the wife of Richard Johnson. Maryland Marriage Licenses and Records Index for Anne Arundel Co. shows a marriage listing for Richard Johnson & Minah Mobberly 17 January 1781. If the marriage took place in 1781 this would put Minah Mobberly

		<p>birth date around 1761. Their son Ephraim Johnson was born in 1788 the 1781 marriage date looks good. Sense no marriage records are available for Montgomery Co. prior to 1796 that part remains unknown. Available Montgomery County Church Records were also checked with no information found. The land comes into the possession of Christian Wyand in 1793 from the heirs of Andrew Buttman/Putman (Wa. Co. Deed H-173) which was a release. Christian Wyand dies in 1812 (Wa. Co. Will C-444). The land then makes it to son in law Jacob Snyder and remains in the family until the last half of the 1800's. Marble Quarry Road Keedysville MD. Area of 39.462147° -77.678772° <p style="text-align: center;">Note</p> Christian Wyand 1745-1811 & Amelia Putman Wyand 1761-1853 headstone is at Mt. Hebron Cemetery Keedysville MD. From information found it appears they were moved from the farm around 1850 and the graveyard plowed over. Unknown if Andrew & Catherine Putman were moved also or they are still buried on the farm. The following is a transcription printed in the "Antietam Valley Record," April, 1899 - from a copy found by Rev. Ezra Clayton Wyand in an old German Bible in the attic of the Christian Wyand home: The burial ground is "here forty-two yards from the fence on the line south of the orchard, and forty-two yards east from the rocks above the branch of water, and about 150 yards direct south from the house, is the side of the family burial plot, and here lies, to my knowledge, the remains of Rose Wyand, my father's sister. My father's
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	<p>brother, Caleb Wyand, pointing out the plot to me on Jan. 1, 1909, remarked that it used to be enclosed with a paling fence, around which he plowed when a boy, and later when the fence had decayed, and fallen, he plowed across the plot. George Fisher, an old colored man, an ex-slave and war veteran, tells me that he and Pembroke Griffith there years ago plowed out grave stones. Mrs. Amelia Rohrer, a descendant who is now in her eightieth year, tells me that she attended funerals which were held in the barn.
