Hill Family Richard Hill	AA. Co.	Richard Hill in 1712 deeds to his brother Joseph Hill 1410 acres (AA. Co. Deed IB 2-6) part of tracts Horn Neck, Reads Lott and other tracts. <b>One acre set aside where Richard Hill (Father of Richard &amp; Joseph Hill) lies buried.</b> Chesapeake Avenue Annapolis MD. Area of 38.966820° -76.486713°
Horner Family Richard Horner	AA. Co.	Richard Horner deeded 100 acres in 1701 to Thomas Reynolds (AA Co. Deed WT 1-188). Deed states “Former grant to Edward Lloyd (late of Severn in AA. Co.) then deeded this tract to Richard Horner (Planter) same place deceased father of Richard Horner ( <b>Except 30 foot square burying place in the orchard</b> ). Deed shows south side of Christopher Rowles plantation in Swan Neck. Edward Lloyd tract Swan Neck patented in 1659 for 600 acres (Patent Book 4-475). West Joyce Lane Arnold MD. Area of 39.022921° -76.518835°
Howard Family John Howard (1667-1704)	AA. Co.	Benjamin Howard (Son of John Howard 1667-1704) deeds to Caleb Dorsey in 1718 (AA Co. Deed IB 2-491)``1232 parts of tracts Crouchfield & Howards Discovery ( <b>Except 30 square feet of Howards</b>

John Howard (1635-1696)		<b>Discovery where Benjamin Howards father and grandfather are buried).</b> Located on south side of Severn River between Hocklys Creek & Wyatts Creek. Pettycoat John Pettycoat	AA. Co.	Samuel Dorsey & John Pettycoat in 1707 deed the tract Wyatts Ridge for 450 acres to Amos Garrett (AA. Co. Deed WT 2-574). <b>Deed states “10 foot square late burying place excepted for the use of John Pettycoat”.</b> Land is located on Broad Creek near head of Round Bay. Crownsville Road and Hawkins Road Crownsville MD. Area of 39.016258° -76.595074°
Ridgely?	AA. Co.	Henry Ridgely deeds to Thomas Worthington in 1712 (AA. Co. Deed PK-458) 420 acres. Parts of the tracts Broome & Waldrig near the tract Nelson laid out for Neale Clarke. <b>Indenture is for 420 acres except the dam and graveyard.</b> Deed states “North of South River and west side of Broad Creek”. Defense Highway & Crownsville Road Parole MD. Area of 38.986756° -76.594240°

Gillis/Shiple/Condon Family John Gilliss 1732-1806 Wife Susannah Shipley Gilliss 1750-1851	Ca. Co.	John Gilliss obtained the land where the graveyard is located by Patent-Andrews Back Branch (Ba. Co. Patent# 333 149 Acres) in 1773. John Gilliss enlarged the tract by Patent-York County (Ba. Co. Unpatented #1785 470 Acres) in 1794. John Gilliss dies in 1806 (Ba. Co. Admin Bond Vol. 9 507) with no will located. Araminta Gilliss Shipley (eldest daughter of John Gilliss) obtained her portion of her fathers land. Araminta Gilliss Shipley dies intestate in 1815 and Adam Shipley (son of Araminta Gilliss Shipley) in 1820 petitioned the court to divide the land (Ba. Co. Deed WG 158-410). The land where the graveyard is located went to her daughter Susannah Gilliss (married Richard U. Condon).

Also states burial location as Jenkins/Gilliss Cemetery at Krimgold Park Woodbine where a graveyard is now surrounded by a chain link fence. Currently who is actually buried here is unknown.</b></p> <p><b>Araminta Gilliss Shipley &amp; John Shipley are also shown at Ebenezer United Methodist Church Cemetery. The persons listed died before Ebenezer Methodist Church Cemetery was established with headstones moved at a later date. Question: did they come from the burial ground listed above or another location?</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Carroll County Cemeteries Condon Family 7-12</p> <p>The Condon Family Cemetery consists of some fieldstones plus three inscribed stones. It is located on the north side of Bethel Road off Woodbine Road. George Wetzel, Doris Manzer and Frances Bellinger copied the inscriptions in 1982. Deed JBB 39-131) with graveyard mentioned. In 1875 George W. Dobbin deeds the land to Reuben Conaway (Ca. Co. Deed FTS 45-260) with graveyard mentioned. In 1911 Arthur Conaway deeds the land to Eve Bower (Ca. Co. Deed 188-284) with graveyard mentioned. See note below for possible burials.</p>

The burial location of Cornelius and Nicholas Jenkins is known. The location of Resin T. Jenkins and his wife Cecilia E. Jenkins is unknown. No probate records have been located. The last appearance is in 1885 (Ca. Co. Deed 62-468). Unknown as to who is buried here. Only possible burials.**

The land where the graveyard is located went to Benjamin Pittinger.</p> <p>In 1824 the estate went to Equity Court for sale of the property which included several other tracts (Fr. Co. Equity Case JS 3-48) with William Miller buying the land of 248 acres. In 1851 William Miller dies and land was sold by order of the Equity Court (Fr. Co. Equity Case ES 2-546 526 acres). The records mention the property starts at Pittingers Graveyard.</p> <p><b>Only headstones found were for Benjamin &amp; Mary A. Pittinger along with son Daniel Pittinger. Also a small stone for Infant Pittinger.</b> Records state Daniel Pittinger married Mary Cookerly. Her burial location is unknown possibly remarried. In 1843 the land was sold by Sarah Warfield to Michael Bartholow Sr. (Ca. Co. Deed JS 2-249 132 Ac.) except 42 square perches for a grave yard. Sarah Warfield (D. 1847) Ca. Co. Will JB 1-445 (1847) Payment for two pairs of tombstones. One for my husband Thomas J. Warfield and one for myself. Enclosed with good substantial fence the burying ground I reserve on the farm now occupied by Washington Barnes near Warfieldsburg. Sarah Warfield married 1<sup>st</sup> George M. In 1825 the land of Joseph Wells was sold to James Smith by John L. Wells (Fr. Co. Deed JS 22-182 431.25 Acres). James Smith was the father of Ann Smith Robertson. In 1845 James Smith sold the land to Ann Robertson (Ca. Co. Deed JS 5-82). James Smith is listed living with his Jeremiah &amp; Ann Robertson in the 1850 &amp; 1860 Carroll Co. MD. Census.</p> <p>Records state “Wells Family Cemetery no longer exist but was located on the west side of Route 27 between Kate Wagner Road &amp; Rolling Ridge Drive. Cemetery was visited by Jacob Holdcraft in the 1960’s with the headstones of Joseph &amp; Susannah Wells and Margaret Turfle located. The headstones of Joseph, Susannah &amp; Betsey Wells are now located at the Westminster Cemetery. The location of the headstone for Margaret Turfle is unknown as well her relation to the Wells Family.</p> <p>Information states” Headstones for the Robertsons were at one time located on the Wells Farm and then moved to Stone Chapel Church Cemetery”. Question Holdcraft only found the Wells headstones. The Robertsons headstones are of good quality but were not found. First human remains found by Samuel M. Kefauver while digging for a water line to his stable. Second human remains found by George Davis while digging a pit for a new gas plant at the church. Headstone found with 1777 inscribed along with a skull and other bones that were placed in a box and buried at another location.</p>
Confederate Soldier	Fr. Co.	<p style="text-align: center;">Valley Register Newspaper Article-Burkittsville March 6, 1881</p> <p>While digging a foundation for a stone wall on the David Arnold Farm. Luther Smothers came upon portions of a skeleton with the thigh bones in a good state of preservation. Mr. Arnold states the body of the soldier was buried by Rev. A.M. Stewart &amp; Alexis Shafer. The body was overlooked when those duty it was to remove the remains to the confederate cemetery at Rose Hill in Hagerstown. Article doesnt state if bones were transferred to Rose Hill Cemetery. Unknown Child	Fr. Co.	<p style="text-align: center;">Valley Register Newspaper 31 March 1899</p> <p>Man and woman both tramps stopped in the barn of Daniel Wolfe near Union Bridge. That night the woman gave birth to a male child and the following day the child died. The child was buried in the orchard back of the barn.</p>

In 1752 William Beall obtained the patent Resurvey on Fattt Oxen (Fr. Co. Patent# 3430 878 Acres). In 1754 Nathaniel Beall (Son of William Beall) obtained 262 acres of Resurvey on Fatt Oxen (Fr. Co. Deed E-372) from his father. Nathaniel Beall dies in 1757 (Prerogative Court Will Liber 30-575) and leaves 131 acres to his son William M. Beall and 131 acres to his son Elisha Beall part of the tract Fatt Oxen. In 1786 Elisha Beall has the land with other land surveyed into the tract named This Is The Way (Fr. Co. Unpatented # 863 265 Acres). Elisha Beall dies in 1837 (Fr. Co. Will GME 2-281).</p> <p><b>In 1844 William M. Beall &amp; George W. Beall (Sons of Elisha Beall) sell the land of Elisha Beall (Fr. Co. Deed HS 23-140 253 Acres-Except 1-3/8 acres for the family graveyard). One headstone remains that of Harriott Beall Simmons 1786-1834. Unknown on the exact number of burials. Elisha Beall stone house still stands.</b></p> <p>3739 Urbana Pike Urbana MD. 39.334095° -77.362535°</p> <p><b>Error: Revolutionary War Records</b></p> <p><b>NSDAR records list Josiah Beall grave found at Boxwood Lodge Urbana Road Frederick MD. in 1952. Josiah Beall died in 1768 well before the war. Josiah Beall (Brother of William Beall the original Boxwood Lodge land owner) never had any ownership of the Boxwood Lodge property.
